



Then Isaiah said: "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals, that you weary my God also? Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son, and shall name him Immanuel."

A Reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

It is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said,

"Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired,
but a body you have prepared for me;
in burnt offerings and sin offerings
you have taken no pleasure.
Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God'
(in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."

When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. For nothing will be impossible with God." Children's Chapel Update

Chapel began with a discussion about the new Church season of Lent: its color, its meaning, and why there are purple veils on the crucifexes, no flowers, and we won't say Alleluia until Easter. They turned the tables on me when they asked me a number of questions which revealed their interest and understanding. I was able to answer a few questions and we will continue our discussion based on what I have found out.

I. What happened to Adam and Eve? They weren't born. Did they die? (Although created by God on the sixth day, they did die.)

2. Who decided the seasons and colors of the Church Year? (I told them it was after Jesus' death and through a little research found out that St. John Chrysostom, in the Fourth Century, in several homilies, set out the Feasts that Christians should celebrate. Pope Innocent III in the Thirteenth Century specified the liturgical colors.) Of course, the Jewish holidays of Passover and Pentecost are mentioned in the Old Testament.


